Terms & Conditions

I, the undersigned, understand that I will be charged the rate indicated above for water taken, plus any fees for damages caused to the Central Iron County Water Conservancy District's (CICWCD) equipment/infrastructure. I will only take water from the locations specified above unless authorized by a CICWCD employee.

I, the undersigned, understand that water hammer (pressure surges) occur from rapid changes in flow. Typically, these rapid changes are associated with the opening and closing of valves. A water hammer occurs when water is forced to stop or change direction very quickly. Simply turning off a shower or sink quickly can cause an audible water hammer inside the pipes and thus water increased flow through a fire hydrant can be very damaging to system components.

I, the undersigned, agree to operate the fire hydrant in the following manner:

1. Hook the hydrant meter to the fire hydrant correctly.
2. Fully open the valve all the way on the fire hydrant.
3. Use the 2 ½ - inch valve on hydrant meter to adjust flow.
4. When turning off water, take a full 60-seconds to shut off any valve.
5. When done for the day or job, turn the valves to the off position.
